In Turkey, the first registries based on the principle of tax begin with Ottoman Empire. Institutionally, the first organization to deal with real estate transactions was found 166 years ago in 1847. Just in the beginning of the establishment of the Republic of Turkey and independent land registry organization was formed in 1924 and the Cadastre Department was added to this structure in 1925. The General Directorate of Land Riegistry and Cadastre has been carrying out its duty determined by the law in its 22 Regional Directorates, 81 cadastre directorates and 957 land registry directorates, serving 20 million citizens every year as well as producing required basic data for many offices and institutions.

Land registry and cadastre service, today, is a dynamic chain of service covering services such as preparing source data for all kinds of planning and organization on the ground and underground, providing spatial dimension data and displaying topographic structure, producing data that can meet the information need required for economy, law, statistics, management, planning and various different scientific researches as well as all kinds of contractual transactions related to land registry and register of immovable properties, to follow up, and control changes on the registers, to ensure the protection of archive records and documents.

These services have the quality of fulfilling the requirements of our county as well as increasing and changing demands in the international basis, finding solutions, amendable to the expected sensibility and credibility within the framework of laws, capable of using the recent technology of today. Many projects have accomplished within this framework since 2004 till today. It would be seen that every single project will contribute to the development of our country in the short, medium and long term.

I believe that Istanbul can provide a world class venue, a strong cultural, technical, Professional and personal experience for delegates and a balanced program of activities that will ensure the 2018 FIG International Congress is very successful event.

I would greatly welcome a decision to host the International Federation for Surveyors FIG Congress in Istanbul in 2018.

On behalf of the General Directorale of Agrarian Reform (GDAR), I wish to support the efforts of Turkish Chamber of Surveying and Cadastre Engineers in their bid to host the Congress & General Assembly of the International Federation of Surveyors 2018 to meet in Istanbul, Turkey.

Turkey is about 75.6 million. The total surface area of Turkey is 778.997 km² consisting of 767.415 km² (98.5%) of continental land of which 34,13 percent is agricultural land. Of the 24 million ha of agricultural land, 8.5 million ha are irrigable. Turkey is one of the few countries in the world that is self-sufficient in terms of food and providing self-subsistence particularly in rural areas. The Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Livestock, through the General Directorate of Agrarian Reform (GDAR), is implementing a program of land consolidation to address the problems of small and fragmented holdings, poorly shaped land parcels, and lack of access to roads. Projects can also include the provision or rehabilitation of infrastructure (e.g. water canals, pipelines, roads, drainage, etc). Land consolidation works has been scaled up significantly from 2009. In total during 2009 - 2013, 196 projects have been launched including 5 million hectares.

We look forward to welcoming all your members to our warm and friendly country and we would do everything in our capability to ensure that all your delegates will assured a safe & smooth entrance into Turkey.

Turkish Chamber of Survey and Cadastre Engineers (CSCE) founded in 1954 and has been a member of FIG since 1969. The Chamber headquarters are located in Ankara connecting 10 branches and 150 provincial representations in Turkey. Chamber has about 3,000 members and covers all FIG Commissions and has appointed a delegate to each Commission.

We can state that in our country Turkey and especially in our chamber we experienced crucial developments. Turkey attracts considerable attention due to its economic growth and its diversified projects in recent years. Perhaps the most crucial one among those is the urban regeneration project. Marmaray is a rail transport project in Istanbul. Marmaray connects Europe and Asia which comprises an undersea rail tunnel under the Bosphorus straight, and the modernization of existing suburban railway lines along the sea Marmara. By the completion of the mass housing projects, the country has now the construction site scenes behind whilst the further constructions in motorways and high speed train tracks are still ongoing.

In our country;

- •Initial cadastral works have been completed.
- •Forest cadastre have also completed as well. Occupied forest lands have been determined and registered nowadays and they are in sold now. Almost 15 billion US dollars is expected from the selling process.
- •Turkish RTK CORS network which consists of 147 reference stations is in operation since 5 years.
- •Real estate registers are in automation since 8 years.
- •National base address information system, citizen information system and court information systems are also in automation since many years.

- •The World Bank funded cadastre renovation project in nationwide is ongoing.
- •Land valuation works are in agenda of Turkey.
- •The most important issue with related NSDI is the establishment of general directorate of geographic information system under the Ministry of Environment and Urbanization.
- •The sultans of the Ottoman Empire had also attached particular relevance to cadastre like napoleon and registered the locations lying within their territorial hegemony. The automation of these inventorial data extending back to the 15th century has been completed.
- •In agricultural lands and rural areas, land consolidation projects which cover 1,000,000 million hectare per year are running.

This geographical area has not hosted any FIG congress, which is held every four years, before. Holding the congress in Istanbul will offer a range of scientific and economic benefits to the city, on one hand, and help our country underline the significance of the role it plays as both a regional and global hub for technology and tourism, on the other hand.

CSCE has been an active member of FIG since 1969. CSCE is now a candidate to host the 2018 FIG General Assembly and Congress in order to provide a platform where countries and organizations can share their professional experiences, projects, latest methods and technology used, and to raise awareness on a global scale by holding technological exhibitions to promote modern technological developments, and organizing technical and leisure trips.

Since 2005, CSCE has been voicing its wish to host a FIG congress at the FIG congresses and Working Week events held in various countries. Accordingly, CSCE had made the necessary preparations to that end and submitted a candidacy application for hosting the 2014 FIG General Assembly and Congress. However, CSCE had lost with only two votes in the voting held to select the country to host the 2014 FIG General Assembly and Congress. The preparations and efforts we have been making at CSCE since 2005 show how strong our urge to host a FIG congress. No such big efforts have ever been made by any other country in FIG's history. Refusing Turkey the right to host a FIG congress despite all these efforts makes our country and professional community sad.

<u>Some of the essential motives behind our wish to host the congress in Turkey are as follows:</u>

- •Increase awareness about the importance of Surveying/Geodesy and Photogrammetry /Geomatics engineering among all public and private organisations in Turkey;
- •Ensure cooperation between our volunteers and foreign colleagues visiting Turkey to attend the Congress;
- •Increase the number of scientific research projects and articles as much as possible; Contribute to the development and application of large-scale projects in public organisations and institutions;
- •Help the private sector restructure itself to adopt a new approach to the industry;
- •Ensure information exchange among scientists and encourage development of applications;
- •Improve qualified workforce to a considerable extent;
- Promote our industry and country to the rest of the world;
- •Increase in the number of survey engineering departments at universities and thereby in the potential for workforce;
- •Rapid increase in the need for information and experience exchange among experts at an international level;
- •Encourage our members to actively participate in FIG's activities and commissions;
- •Help Surveying/Geodesy and Photogrammetry/ Geomatics engineering students and young surveyors cooperate with their foreign counterparts and thus develop universal perspectives;

•Make efforts to encourage neighbouring countries and the experts living in them to join FIG.

Hosting the congress in Turkey will enable us to ensure that the current professional practices in Turkey be evaluated by experts to address and develop solutions for professional deficiencies, awareness in our professional community be improved, professional information and ideas be exchanged among experts, and that the projects conducted in our country be promoted to and discussed with foreign experts.

Turkey has built very close relations with the Turkish-speaking countries which acquired their independence after 1990 and with which we share a common language, a common history and a common memory, and paved the path towards strengthening both bilateral and regional relations. This approach has in recent years further grown, stretching into Mid-Asia, Eastern Europe, North and Central Africa and on into the Middle East where many development projects are being supported by Turkey, both financially and technically.

The Survey, Land Registry and Cadastre industry in Turkey has been experiencing considerable improvements and organising professional events with all of its segments as it feels the need to share its experience with the neighbouring countries. Each of these countries is striving to become a globally recognized centre of attraction in terms of our profession. Their focus is now on cadastre and property ownership.

As a result of the need mentioned above, CSCE and FIG plan to jointly hold a workshop on "Property Ownership" as part of the Congress. Thus, closer ties between these countries and FIG will be built through these events to help FIG acquire new members in an effort to expand its presence in the world.

The congress will support selected speakers from developing countries by providing 20+ free registration and 50+ free or affordable accommodation. Additional support will be sought from aid programmes, donators or from the congress budget.

Besides looking after effective coordination in professional engagements, various activities are also carried out at CSCE, whereby specific importance is attached to the training of freshmen. Young Surveyors Days and summer camps are the most significant events launched for such an aim, in which the students of Surveying/Geomatics engineering departments are hosted and subjected to a 10 day training course in summer. In context of these organizations which take place on the seaside, the trainees are gaining technical, social and administrative skills, as well. Naturally, other occasional entertainment organizations, animation actions and music contests are not neglected. In this respect, we are gladly ready to host 4-5 students in our premises as to be nominated by the FIG management.

For the past ten years, CSCE has been organizing the Young Surveyors Days to gather Young Surveyors from all over the World. In parallel with the FIG 2018 congress CSCE will organize a "Young Surveyors Day".

We look forward to welcoming the FIG Director to experience the sights and sounds of Istanbul with a site inspection.


This year, i.e. 2013, UNESCO celebrates the 500th anniversary of the World Map drawn by Piri Reis, a renowned Turkish-Ottoman admiral and cartographer, in 1513. It gives us great motivation and enthusiasm to meet cartographers and surveyors from around the world in Turkey, and we believe it should be celebrated by our colleagues and industry across the world. We are very happy and proud in that respect.

"Pirî Reis is one of the foremost names in the history of Turkish cartography and navigation. In the 16th century Ottoman cartography made a major leap forward with the maps and charts drawn by Pirî Reis. This large scale world map that he drew in 1513 demonstrates his knowledge and skill. It shows south-western Europe, northwest Africa, southeast and central America, and gives written information about the New World. It is a portolan chart without latitudinal or longitudinal lines, showing only the coasts and islands. As Pirî Reis himself explains, he made use of the map of America drawn by Christopher Columbus in addition to other earlier European and Islamic maps, as well as his own observations."



Historic Peninsula


As the former capital of the Byzantine and Ottoman empires, present day Istanbul retains the history that emerged form the city and integrates its historical values to the modern life. Sultanahmet, located at the center of the historic peninsula, is where most of the Istanbul's famous historical sights are located. Hagia Sophia and the Blue Mosque are both situated in this dynamic part of the city. A few hundred meters away is the world famous Grand Bazaar, which for the past six centuries has been a center for the trading of gold and authentic Turkish products. The nearby Basilica Cistern is a breathtaking venue for banquets and special events. North of the historic peninsula, across the Golden Horn, is Galata, crowned by the Galata tower. Galata, Beyoğlu and the Istiklal Street accommodate much of the city's nightlife venues.



Beyoğlu, Istanbul's culture and entertainment center, has always been a meeting point for cultures and people. The multiculturalism of this vibrant district is abundantly reflected in architecture, daily life and culinary culture. Electronic Visa Application

Citizens of an additional 97 countries can obtain an e-visa*

Turkey's e-Visa application system offers to its applicants a comfortable and practical way to obtain visa. E-visa is an endorsement allowing the bearer to enter Turkey.

As of April 17, 2013, electronic visa (e-Visa) replaces "sticker visa" which was issued at the border crossings. Applicants obtain their visa electronically after entering required information and making payment by credit card. After successful application, e-Visa is e-mailed to the applicant. Applicants must print out their e-Visa, show it to airport officials and customs officers and carry it with them at all times during the travel. Passports should be valid at least six months longer than the expiry date of the requested visa. E-Visa is only valid for tourism or trade purposes.

Topkapı was built between 1459 and 1465 as the seat of government of the newly installed Ottoman regime. 12.00 Lunch will be at Konyali Restaurant After the lunch tour will be continue with Grand Bazaar Tour In 1461 Sultan Mehmet II built the first bazaar of wood, now called "Eski Bedesten" the primitive all. After several fires the bazaar was reconstructed in 1894. Today the domed buildings surrounded by a wall, occupies an area of 200.000 square meters. Approximately 4.000 shops are spread out in a giant labyrinth of small streets and passages, which are mostly arranged according to their trades: rugs, antiques, gold, silver, leather etc.



Visit the **Kariye Muzesi,** originally the **Church of St. Saviour** in **Chora** and dating back to the reign of Constantine the Great in the 4th century. Much of the structure you see today largely dates from the 11th century. Once a mosque, it is now a museum famous for its superb mosaics depicting scenes from the life of Christ, which mainly date from the 1320's.

Access to Istanbul

Istanbul is accessible from all parts of the world, served by more than 300 international airlines. Besides air transport, visitors to Istanbul have several options; international train, ferry, bus services and other means of transportation connecting Istanbul to neighboring European countries. The city has two international airports, Sabiha Gökçen Airport on the Asian side and Atatürk Airport on the European side.

Istanbul is connected to highways that provide a link to most European cities -Germany, France, Bulgaria, Greece, Syria, Russia, Romania, Saudi Arabia, Iran and Syria are but a land trip away from Istanbul. Although the Orient Express is no longer available, there are modern international trains. Sea transportation is very developed in Istanbul, which has a number of ports by which the ferries can dock.

Istanbul is a large metropolis with over 13.9 million inhabitants. Therefore the city has an extensive public transport network. Public transportation in Istanbul consists of an extensive bus network, rail systems, funiculars, and maritime services. It is advisable to purchase an Akbil, a debit card usable in most forms of public transportation within the city.

Air Travel

Istanbul is accessible from all parts of the world, served by more than 300 international airlines. The city has two international airports, Sabiha Gökçen Airport on the Asian side and İstanbul Atatürk Airport on the European side. The 3rd International airport is planned to be complete in 2015 with 150 million capacity.

Atatürk International Airport hosts around 950-1.000 flights a day and services approximately 129.000 passengers a day, a figure that rises to 140.000 to 150.000 and flights to 1.100 to 1.150 a day at peak times. Yearly, 239.649 flights were hosted at Atatürk International Airport. On the other hand Sabiha Gökçen Airport has served nearly 15 million passengers in 2012 and served appromixatelty 30.600 passangers a day.



Yearly, 114.672 and daily 314 domestic flights were hosted at Atatürk International Airport. At Sabiha Gökçen International Airport 70.107 domestic flights were hosted. Domestic list of carriers are; Atlasjet, Free Bird Airlines, Onur Air, Pegasus Airlines and Turkish Airlines . Turkish Airlines has direct 43 domestic flights and 1832 total weekly frequency.

Istanbul Atatürk International Airport

Istanbul Atatürk International Airport is the city's gateway to the world, hosting millions of passengers every year and servicing airlines from all over the world. With its architecture, speed of passenger throughput, level of service and advanced technology, it is also one of the top airports in the world. Operated by TAV Istanbul Terminal Operations Co., a subsidiary of TAV Airports Holding since 2000, the airport is ranked as the second in the category "Best Airport of South Europe" in "The World's Best Airports 2009 Awards" event organized by Skytrax Research, the leading research Advisors to the world airline and air transport industry based in London, UK.

The data on movement to and from the airport, shows Turkey's integration to the world. Atatürk International Airport hosts around 750 to 800 flights a day and services approximately 90,000 passengers a day, a figure that rises to 100.000 to 110.000 and flights to 900 to 950 a day at peak times. The airport is situated 28 kilometers west of city center on 9.470.554 square meters of land. Transportation to and from the airport is available by metered taxis as well as subway, which starts from the city center, municipal buses, and shuttle buses of the HAVA\$ company, which also operates ground services at the airport. The airport hosts 40 cafes, bars, restaurants and refreshment stalls with a combined seating capacity of 5.250. Transportation Within the City

Various transportation vehicles are available in Istanbul, one of the biggest cities in Europe. Railroads, bus lines, and trams are supported by sea vehicles that travel between two continents.

The city has an integrated electronic ticket system which uses smart RFID cards called **Istanbulkart**. 'Istanbul Card' used in almost all transportation vehicles which approximately 4 € and can be purchased from offices near major transport interchanges all around the city. The website www.iett.gov.tr submits detailed information on transportation alternatives.

In addition, Istanbul offers an extensive mass transit network including metro, light-rail, buses and shared taxis, as well as a fleet of over 16,000 taxis. Mass transit is easy to use and affordable.

Buses

Metropolitan buses in Istanbul are frequent and economic. They travel to almost any point within the city and some villages around the city. Alternatives are privately operated buses using the same lines where you can pay onboard. The "metrobus", which operates between Söğütlüçeşme on the Asian side and Avcılar on the European side, is another popular transportation alternative that can save a lot of time.

Railway

The modern subway and tram system is one of the most convenient means of transportation in Istanbul. Trains departing from Sirkeci on the European side and Haydarpaşa on the Anatolian side reach the outer parts of the city.

Subway

The Istanbul Metro, or the M2, is a mass-transit underground railway network, running from the Atatürk Oto Sanayi station at Maslak in the north to the fiişhane station at Beyoğlu in the south.







Transportation Within the City

Tram

The tramline lines are Zeytinburnu-Kabataş, Güngören-Bağcılar and Edirnekapı-Sultançiftliği. Taksim, the cultural and entertainment center of the city is accessible from Kabataş by a short funicular railway. A light rail line, known as M1, runs from Yusufpaşa, near Aksaray, to Esenler and Atatürk Airport.

Sea

The sea route is usually the quickest way between the European and Asian sides, particularly during rush-hour. Ferries connect the two sides of the city. There are city-line ferries that run the length of the Bosphorus and the Golden Horn, and also go to and from the islands. There are also tourist excursions along the Bosphorus.

Smaller private motorboats that depart from Beşiktaş on the European side drop their passengers at Üsküdar on the Asian side in six minutes. The modern catamarans are for those who want to get about fast.

Marmaray Tunnel

It comprises an undersea rail tunnel under the Bosphorus strait, and the modernization of existing suburban railway lines along the Sea of Marmara from Halkalı on the European side to Gebze on the Asian side. It is the first standard gauge rail connection between Europe and Asia.

Taxi

Licensed taxis in istanbul are yellow and have registration numbers on the sides. They can be found on the ranks or hailed on the street. Also hotel, restaurant and bar staffs provide taxi. Bridge tolls are added onto the taxi fare.

Dolmuş

One practical solution to transportation in istanbul is the dolmuş, a shared taxi seating 7 or 8 passengers that operates on specific routes through the busiest parts of the city until midnight. The destination is written on signs placed on the windscreen.









Connectivity to Proposed Venue

From Ataturk International Airport to the Proposed Venue there are varous options as below;

Taxi;

The taxi cost from the airport to the city centre is between 13 − 18 €. From the airport to the city centre Taksim is 20 km/12.5 miles. Appromixately 40 minutes.

(Taxi:1 km is 1.90 TL which is appromixately 0.70 €).

Bus and metro;

Public bus/metro ticket is approximately 0.70 €. 45-60 minutes.

Shuttle Service;

The airport shuttle servise (HAVATAŞ) is 10 TL which is approximately 4 € to the city centre (Taksim) 45-60 minutes.



Meeting go green in Istanbul

Comfort, luxury and technical infrastructure are no longer the only considerations while organizing international congresses. As the importance of environmentally responsible practices has dramatically grown in every aspect of life, congress tourism was also affected by this phenomenon. As host of the 5th World Water Forum, Istanbul put environmental concerns at the forefront of its agenda. Sustainability in the meetings, incentives, events and the conference industry in general have become a key issue for meeting planners, national associations and corporations in the city. Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality (İBB) and the Governorship of Istanbul help meeting planners in organizing environmentally responsible practices. Bureau Veritas and the Turkish Hotels and Investors Association (TUROB) teamed up to launch "The Hotel Greening Project" in order to move the environmental agenda forward with Istanbul's hotels by encouraging them to employ environmentally friendly strategies. The pilot project was realized during the 5th World Water Forum's Green Forum Initiative to raise awareness on hotel greening techniques and to allow participating hotels take the first step toward greener accommodations. Twenty-three hotels volunteering to participate in the Hotel Greening Project were audited according to the measurements of energy efficiency, water conservation and waste management practices, among other criteria. Hotels attaining a minimum standard received a certificate from Bureau Veritas and the GFI. Top performers in specific star categories received the "Green Steps Award".

Green Venues and Accommodation

ICVB supports green initiatives, so that the city of Istanbul can move forward on the corporate social responsibility front. Several meeting venues in Istanbul lead a variety of initiatives that create a natural environment, reduce energy usage and use minimal non-renewable resources. Some of these initiatives are: • Maximum natural light • Walking distance to hotels • Congress facilities located in the city center offer delegates the opportunity of walking • Easily accessible public transportation • Recycling bins for papers, plastics, glasses placed within the venues • Several venues employ a system for distilling waste oils in the kitchens • "Energy Smart Lighting" within venues • Recycling pens are being used at the meeting rooms • Smoking is banned in all closed public spaces within the venues.

By contributing to reforestation and other environmental cleaning projects led by NGOs like Turkish Marine Environment Protection Association (DenizTemiz), Turkish Foundation for Combating Soil Erosion, Reforestation and the Protection of Natural Habitats (TEMA) and the World Wildlife Found (WWF); meeting planners, congress organizers, corporations and associations help promoting green efforts in Istanbul. Venues and hotels in is anbul predominantly use local food produced in Istanbul and Turkey, which is an important part of the broader sustainability movement.





Turkey: Where Culture, History & Nature Meets

Turkey hosts the memories of various civilizations with historic sites and archaeological wonders set in a diverse and beautiful landscape. Turkey builds on an old and rich history. It represents a cultural mixture, stretching across the Anatolian peninsula in Western Asia and Thrace in the Balkans. The Anatolian peninsula is one of the oldest continuously inhabited regions in the world. The earliest Neolithic settlements such as Çatalhöyük, Çayönü, Nevali Cori, Hacılar, Göbekli Tepe and Mersin are considered to be among the earliest human settlements in the world. Anatolia is a melting pot where Sumerian, Babylonian and Assyrian cultures interacted with Hittites, Romans, Lycians and Phrygians. The result is a unique Anatolian civilization which has long inspired the thoughts and legends of the West.

Any visitor to Turkey will be struck by the plethora and variety of religious buildings and ancient shrines. There are temples dedicated to ancient goods, churches of many denominations, synagogues and mosques. As civilizations succeeded each other for thousands of years, they left their religious legacy. After the monotheistic domination of Anatolia, Islam, Christianity, and Judaism coexisted in harmony. The ancient Bronze Age witnessed the establishment of the first independent city states. The first major empire in the area was that of the Hittites, from the 18th through the 13th century BC. Next were the Phrygians, an Indo-European community. The other prominent states of the period were Lydia, Caria and Lycia. Meanwhile Ionians, one of the ancient Greek communities, were settling at the western coasts of Anatolia. In 334 BC, Alexander the Great got the hold of the whole region and this also marked the beginning of the Hellenistic period since Anatolia was divided into small kingdoms. All these kingdoms joined Rome by the 1st century BC. In 324 AD, the Roman emperor Constantine I announced Byzantium as the new capital of the Roman Empire. He renamed Byzantium as the New Rome which would be called Constantinople and Istanbul respectively.







Turkey: Where Culture, History & Nature Meets

After the fall of the Western Roman Empire, Constantinople became the capital of the Byzantine Empire. In the 10th century the Seljuk Turks started migrating to Anatolia. After the Battle of Malazgirt, Anatolia became the homeland for the Oğuz Turkic tribes. The war gave way to the foundation of Anatolian Seljuk state, which would later be defeated by Mongols. While the state was slowly collapsing, the Turkish principality governed by Osman I was to evolve into the Ottoman Empire. Throughout its history of 623 years, the Ottoman Empire acted as a link between the Western and Eastern worlds. Until it collapsed at the end of World War I, the empire was a major economic and cultural center.

Modern Turkish Republic founded after the War of Independence by Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, is among the fastest growing countries of Europe. One of Turkey's most important features is its capacity for synthesis, which is a historical inheritance. Such a rich history has left an unforgettable mark and Turkey flourishes with historic sites and archaeological wonders set in a diverse and beautiful landscape. The Mediterranean coastline is punctuated with well-preserved Greco-Roman cities such as Pergamon and Ephesus, while the austere and rugged Anatolian plateau has cave churches hidden away in the fairytale landscape of Cappadocia. This is the land where Alexander the Great slashed the Gordion Knot, where Achilles battled the Trojans in Homer's Illiad, where the first coin was minted in Sardis and where the Ottoman Empire fought battles that shaped the world.




Pre-Post Tours

Turkey: Country Profile

Location and Geography:

Republic of Turkey is located on the crossroads between Europe and Asia with most of its territory called Anatolia located in Southwest Asia. Turkey is surrounded by three different seas, the Black Sea on the north, the Aegean Sea on the west and the Mediterranean Sea on the south. Turkey is neighboured to the east by Georgia, Armenia and Iran while to the south by Iraq and Syria, then to the west by Greece and Bulgaria. Turkey has a total area of 783.562 m2 (302.535 sq. mi) –



Turkey's dynamic economy is a complex mix of modern industry and commerce along with a traditional agriculture sector that still accounts for more than 35% of employment. Turkey has the world's 15th largest GDP-PPP and 17th largest Nominal GDP. The country is a founding member of the OECD and the G-20 major economies. Key sectors of the Turkish economy are banking, construction, home appliances, electronics, textiles, oil refining, petrochemical products, food, mining, iron and steel, machine industry and automotive.

Istanbul City Profile

Location

Istanbul is located in the north-west Marmara Region of Turkey. It encloses the southern Bosporus which places the city on two continents— the western portion of Istanbul is in Europe, while the eastern portion is in Asia. The city boundaries cover a surface area of 1,830.93 square kilometres (707 sq mi), while the metropolitan region, or the Province of Istanbul, covers 6,220 square kilometres (2,402 sq mi).

Demographics

Istanbul is the largest populated city of Turkey with a population of 13,9 million. As one of the largest urban agglomerations in Europe, Istanbul is one of the world's largest cities by population. Istanbul has 39 districts administered by the Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality. The city boundaries cover a surface area of 1830 square kilometers (707 mi²) and Istanbul Province covers 6220 square kilometers (2402 mi²)

Economy:

8th out of OECD's 78 metro-regions with its population size, Istanbul is literally a metropolis. Istanbul is the financial capital of Turkey because of its strategical location. The city generates almost 27 percent of Turkey's GDP (\$332,4 billion in 2012) and its annual contribution to the state budget is about 40 percent. As the country's largest industrial center, approximately 20 percent of the country's industrial labor is employed in Istanbul. Some of the city's main industrial products are food processing, textile production, oil products and alcoholic drinks. Istanbul is also the most important export and import gate of Turkey with respectively 46% and 40% of Turkey's total exportation / importation activity.

Safety & Security

Turkey is one of the safest countries in the world in which to travel, and its crime rate is low in comparison to many Western European countries. Interpol ranked Turkey as the safest holiday destination in Europe for travellers. As is the case when travelling in any country though, travellers need to be careful with their personal possessions when out and about and never leave items unattended.

Istanbul City Profile

The police is helpful and friendly and in many of the tourist resorts there are special tourism police who speak different languages. The Turkish Government takes air safety very seriously, and maintains strict oversight, particularly on international flights. The U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has places Turkey's civil aviation authority in Category 1-in full compliance with international aviation safety standards in overseeing Turkey's air carrier operations. In the days following the September 11 attacks, Turkish Airlines was one of the first international airlines cleared by the FAA to fly into the United States. Istanbul is Europe's third and world's 21st biggest city.

As researches demonstrates, if these trends continue, Istanbul will be the most crowded city of Europe by 2020. Despite its population of more than 12 million people as well as the mass of visitors coming from various different countries, the city is enlisted among the safest cities in the world despite its highly dense population. This gives a sense of peace to citizens and visitors alike as the city's historical heritage carries them through the ages. According to the available data, one of every 66 people in Istanbul is involved in a crime. This is compared to one of 14 people in Budapest, one of seven people in Vienna, one of eight people in Luxembourg, one of 34 people in Sofia, and one of six people in Berlin.

The research conducted by the EU Crime and Security Consortium, exposes however that 18% of people in Istanbul become victims of a crime as compared to 32% in London, 27% in Amsterdam, 26% in Belfast and Dublin, 24% in Copenhagen, 23% in New York and Stockholm, 20% in Brussels, 19% in Rome. While total public crimes were recorded as 148,165 in 2005 in Istanbul, there were 262,176 in Berlin, 1,015,121 in London, and 200,177 in Paris. Crime rates in Istanbul, however, have been considerably lowered during the past three years as the result of successful operations by law enforcement units and by the use of MOBESE (acronym for Integrated Mobile Electronic System of CCTV). When compared with the first four months of 2007-2008, there has been a decline of 21% in general crimes, 38% in homicide, swindling, and 59% in pick-pocketing.

MOBESE is a "City Information and Security System" enacted under the Istanbul Security Department with the support of Istanbul's Governorship. With the 584 modern cameras installed in several of Istanbul's streets and squares with the aim of enhancing public services, facilitating administrative functions, and further decreasing crime rates. Twelve different systems, including 952 quarters, 3,500 police vehicles, 150 mobile police station units, the foundation of Province and District Command Centers, and City Security Directorate, were integrated with MOBESE. Starting with the emergency services, the other institutions are planned to be integrated into the system as necessary.
