






Trinidad & Tobago






Ultra-high resolution (5cm GSD) precisely positioned PLACE (10cm) aerial imagery (Grand Turk Jan. 2023)

WHAT WE SOLVE FOR

1 Funding

PLACE funds the data collection and pays all foreign costs including our training. We pay for local data collectors directly. Government costs are in kind and manageable within local budgets, i.e. transport, GCPs, per diem, housing, flight clearances and other permits and customs clearance.

2 Procurement

PLACE is a non-profit. We are not selling hardware, software or services. As a non-profit our job is to create the data, provide it to government, and manage a standard data platform for access by members. As there is no cost to Government there are no procurement requirements meaning we can move quickly to deliver actionable data.

3 Opportunity

PLACE focuses on producing high quality MINIMALLY processed imagery data. This provides members with opportunity to create their derived works. These derived works can be accessed by members through a one-time commercial license payment to PLACE for each data vintage, resulting in their full ownership in perpetuity for derived works. Derived works can also be accessed through a non-commercial license for no additional license fee but requires derived works to be put into the public space. PLACE itself does not create derived works of any type.

4 Quality Standards

All data produced by PLACE is collected using singular rigorous production specifications (see Annex) which produces a standardized product across all geographies. Data is made available in perpetual bulk download license, limited term bulk download, and COGS STAC API in AWS.

5 Inclusion

Our members have a voice in how we govern ourselves, license and price access to our data, and set our technology standards. We have three working committees that members participate in. We run a rigorous KYC process for all members. Membership is open to all organizations (not individuals) in good standing who must agree to terms and conditions of use. All members have equal access to all data. Membership in PLACE requires a minimum annual contribution of USD500 which is tax deductible for US corporations.

6 Sovereignty

All data produced by PLACE is owned by Government. PLACE receives a license from Government to a copy of the data and puts it in the PLACE Trust in the UK for use by the PLACE Community. All original data for each country is provided on disk to government solving for growing data residency and sovereignty issues from Governments.














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GEOSPATIAL CONCERNS OF TURKS & CAICOS ISLANDS

- Access to up to date data, and the tools to enable it's usage historical challenge





















Place Imagery and Urban Growth Estimation 2012-2023
