



The continuum of land rights is not a theory, it is rather a powerful concept, or metaphor, for understanding this rich land tenure diversity


- Rights to land are regarded as lying on a continuum between informal and formal
- In between these lie a wide and complex spectrum of rights
















FORMAL LAND REGISTRATION

Improvement of Informal settlements

- Involves collection of household or settlement-level data on land tenure, housing, basic services and socio-economic data
- Data-driven decision-making for development and implementation of inclusive tenure security and urban planning policies and programmes in informal settlements



Restitution of Housing, Land and Property Rights

- Protection of HLP rights is crucial for social reconciliation, economic recovery and addressing inequalities that were exacerbated during the conflict
- Rapid registration of HLP rights that sets the basis for more comprehensive land and HLP-related interventions in the future

COVID-19 Effects

- Unprecedented; All are affected
- Poor, women, youth and vulnerable groups are disproportionately impacted
- Government services and programmes were put on hold and/or delayed
- In poor urban and rural communities, more risk of forced evictions; increased tenure insecurity
- For GLTN interventions
 - delayed activities;
 - health risks;
 - cost implications;
 - potential challenges on funding











Emerging Lessons

- Continuum of land rights framework works
- Inclusive, fit-for-purpose and gender/youth responsive land tools and approaches facilitate tenure security and other development objectives
- Community-based information systems helps accelerate COVID-19 responses
- Building capacities of poor communities is going beyond tenure security; it builds sustainability and resilience
- Land is about people ---They should be at the Center of policies, projects and practices
