







# CROSS SECTIONAL VIEW OF THE ANTONINE WALL CONSTRUCTION

#### The Antonine Wall

- O Coins indicate that Pius, through his legate Lollius Urbicus, had regained control of the land Hadrian retreated from by 143 A.D.
- O The wall was built out of turf and stood 9ft. high. It runs for 37 miles, and has less fortification than Hadrian's wall.







- 5 TIMBER FACE WALL











DIAGRAM OF THE FIRST INSCRIBED STONE FOUND ON THE WALL c.1565




## WILLIAM ROY'S GREAT MAP OF THE ANTONINE WALL



## DETAIL OF A ROMAN CAMP ON ROY'S MAP




